1. Purpose:

- 1.1. To align with the Dubai Health Authority (DHA) vision, mission and strategic objective, to direct resources to ensure healthy and safe environment for Dubai population.
- 1.2. To implement best practices, to improve efficacy, proper utilization and patient safety in regard to medicines, medical products and chemicals within all pharmacies in the Emirate of Dubai.
- 1.3. To mandate the requirement and specifications for identifying, tracking, checking and inspecting Expiry dates of drugs and medical products and chemicals to ensure the safety and competent delivery of pharmaceutical services.

2. <u>Scope:</u>

2.1. Medications Disposal and Waste Management process in health facilities/pharmaceutical facilities.

3. Definitions and Abbreviations:

Controlled Drug: is a medical and pharmaceutical product that contain any of the active substances in accordance with Federal Law No. (14) of 1995 in respect of of combating Narcotics and psychotropic





substances and its amendments, and the lists of the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB) No. (1,2,3,4) contained in the United Nations Convention of 1971, which have a significant potential for abuse, addiction and/or illegal use.

Expiration date/ Expiry date: Reflects the shelf life of a commercially manufactured product when stored according to the manufacturer approved labelling, in its original container. It is the date before which the quality of a medicine remains acceptable for intended use.

Health Facility: Place permitted to provide health examinations for patients and help for diagnosis, treatment, nursing or admission for cure and recovery or any other related medical procedures relating to treatment or rehabilitation post treatment.

Narcotic Drugs: All natural or synthetic substances listed in Schedules 1, 2, 3, and 4, which are annexed to the aforementioned decree-law".

Pharmaceutical product: A medical product manufactured in a specific pharmaceutical form and has specific uses in humans or animals.

Pharmacy: A facility licensed to store, prepare, compound, dispense, display or sell medicinal products to the public directly, through a fixed or mobile facility, permanent or temporary.

Pharmacist: A person who holds a scientific qualification not less than a bachelor's degree in pharmacy or its equivalent from a higher institute, college or university recognized in the country, and who is licensed to practice the profession of pharmacy in the country in accordance with the provisions of Federal Law no. (8) of (2019) Concerning Medical products, Pharmacy profession and Pharmacies and its executive regulations.





Pharmacist in-charge: is the pharmacist licensed by DHA on a licensed pharmaceutical facility, and is responsible for implementing the provisions of Federal Law no. (8) of (2019) Concerning Medical products, Pharmacy profession and Pharmacies and its executive regulations within the scope of the tasks assigned to him.

Register: is a book issued from the concerned Health Authority (DHA or Ministry of Health and Prevention (MOHAP)) used by an authorized Healthcare Professionals at health facilities to record the transactions of Narcotics, CD and SCD medications within the pharmacy and inpatient units.

Semi Controlled Drugs: is a medical and pharmaceutical product not listed within the schedules attached to the Federal law No. 14 of 1995 in respect of combating of drugs and psychotropic substances and its amendments and not listed within the schedules attached to international conventions of the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB), and has medical benefits, but with long term use in high doses or use with other substances that might lead to habituation and addiction.

4. Policy Statement:

- 4.1. All DHA licensed health facilities should have a Pharmaceutical Waste Collection Certificate from contracted medical waste management company approved by Dubai Municipality (DM) to confirm that medications are disposed safely.
- 4.2. All health facilities providing pharmaceutical services must comply with the manufacturer specifications and guidelines for the management, storage and use of medications and check for expired medication on a monthly basis.
- 4.3. Health facilities must ensure that all expired, damaged, recalled or withdrawn medications are kept in designated cabinets/areas, clearly labeled and separated from the active stock.
- 4.4. Health facilities must put in place a Medications Disposal and Waste Management plan approved by the pharmacist in charge /Pharmacy Manager.
- 4.5. Expired/unusable and damaged medications shall be returned to the distributing drug stores from which they were purchased, and to obtain credit note for evidence (as applicable).
- 4.6. All expired/unused Narcotic drugs shall be subject to DHA Narcotic Disposal request approval (Appendix 1) and subsequently returned to the MOHAP Central Medical Stores.
- 4.7. Any expired medications that cannot be repossessed by the drug store shall be discarded by the health facility as medical waste.
- 4.8. Health facilities are permitted to dispose drugs through DM or a medical waste management contractor approved by DM after obtaining DHA written approval.
- 4.9. Health facilities must have in place an agreement/contract with the nominated entity for disposal of medical waste which approved by DM.





- 4.10. The health facility can dispose of expired CD/SCD medications at the end of each quarter in accordance with the provisions of the applicable legislation and the regulations approved by DHA and the competent authorities in the Emirate of Dubai.
- 4.11. All health facilities are entitled to apply for "Medication Disposal Request Form" (Appendix 2).
- 4.12. Health facilities must complete the application form for the disposal of medication and submit the application electronically through Drug control section (DCS) official e-mail: DrugControl@dha.gov.ae.
- 4.13. Upon receiving completed form, inspection team from DCS shall visit the health facility within five
 (5) working days, audit drugs to be disposed and make sure that both parties sign the Medications
 Disposal Request Form and to be stamped by the facility's stamp.
- 4.14. All CD/SCD disposal transactions shall be documented by the DHA inspection team in the corresponding CD/SCD registers.
- 4.15. Any CD/SCD drug discrepancies during DHA inspection team audit will be considered as a violation and shall be reported to Medical Practice Committee (MPC) for further action.
- 4.16. Once receiving the approval from the DCS to proceed with the disposal process, a Pharmaceutical Waste Collection Certificate to be collected from the medical waste management company approved by Dubai Municipality (DM) and saved in the facility.
- 4.17. All facilities must ensure to dispose all the expired, damaged or recalled medications and the DCS team will audit the Pharmaceutical Waste Collection Certificate during the next routine inspection visit.
