





MRCGP[INT] COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

Exam Area Safety Measures:

- Maintain a minimum of 2 meters (6 feet) distance between all individuals
- Wearing a facemask is a mandatory requirement to enter the exam area.
- The entrance area or the security staff will screen people for COVID-19 related disease symptoms based on a visual inspection and screening equipment and /or questionnaire.
- Use of hands sanitizing should be enforced before checking-in.
- Declaration form has to be duly signed and submitted to the registration area.
- Participants should not share any items such as pens, documents, etc.
- Avoid any physical contact such as handshakes or any other type of physical contact.
- Gathering in common areas are not allowed
- Each station will be provided with a sanitizing kit for hand hygiene and disinfecting wipes to clean items to be used before and after each case scenario.
- Everyone is encouraged to sanitize his or her hands thoroughly before entering the examination room or area using hand wash or an alcohol based hand rub.
- A thorough cleaning scheme will be in place to ensure these areas are free from potential COVID-19.
- During the exam, cleaning and disinfecting activities will take place frequently for all areas where people have direct and constant contact.
- All health and safety measures will be communicated to examiners and candidates before the exam

Important information for candidates:

- Maintain two meters distance from other candidates while standing in a queue and entering, or leaving the exam area.
- **CCSA Candidates** must bring their own instruments (Stethoscope, Otoscope, Ophthalmoscope, Tuning Forks, Torch and Hammer).
- MCQ and Written Paper Candidates must bring their own pencils, erasers and blue or black pens.
- Display dispensers of alcohol-based hand rub prominently around the venue.
- Hand hygiene should be maintained at all times during the exam.
- If you develop warning signs of COVID-19, contact one of the exam staff immediately.
- Please stay home if you feel unwell on the exam day.
